- (b) <u>Little London</u>. Following repeated vehicle damage to one local property the Clerk has been in liaison with residents and CCC regarding the possible replacement of traffic signs on Little London. As funding isn't currently available for these signs it was proposed by DB and seconded by MB that in the first instance a letter would be written to Mr Clarke asking him to ensure HGV vehicles do not access his farm via Little London.
- (c) War Memorial. The Clerk has contacted the War Memorial grant organisation regarding our application for repairs to the war memorial. As this will not be considered in the near future it was agreed that Mr Wilding be asked to undertake some interim repairs prior to the November Remembrance Day Service.

#### 17-18/125 COUNTY & DISTRICT COUNCILLORS REPORT & BUSINESS

(a) County Councillors Report.

Councillor Raynes highlighted CCC's ongoing priority of balancing their 2017-18 budget. One of the current challenges is the increasing expenditure by social Services in response to national and local Safeguarding concerns.

Councillor Raynes reiterated his willingness to hear the thoughts and opinions of Parish Councillors regarding the future of the mobile library service.

(a) Beeches Car Park. CP commented on the extremely poor state of the entrance into The Beeches car park and the adverse effect that this was having on both guests using The Beeches as well as on local residents, whose vehicles / properties are being covered in dusk. It was noted that the one quote received to date would indicate the cost to tarmac the entire car park would be in excess of £90k. It was agreed that the Clerk pursue other tenders for this work and to explore the possibility of a Public Works Loan. These are to then be considered by the Finance working party when they meet on 23<sup>rd</sup> October.

Parking. A significant number of complaints have been received from local residents who have experienced parking / highways safety problems during recent Youth Football matches. A number of possibilities for potentially improving this problem were suggested, including the staggering of KO times, utilising the school car park and providing more effective marshalling of vehicles. The balance of the 16-17 grant will go towards repainting the yellow lines in the vicinity of the Co-op as well as painting a new 'no parking' zone on the footpath outside the Co-op.

  (b) <u>Highways Working Party Report.</u> RR shared the recent highways working party audit.

  (see appendix 3) Key action included the cutting back of identified hedges on; Station Clerk Road, Prickwillow Road, Maltings Lane, Sun Street, Beck Road, Waterside and The Causeway.
- (c) Other highways issues:
  - BM shared the difficulty of one Maltings Lane resident to access her drive at the start / end of school days due to badly parked vehicles. The Clerk confirmed that the PCSO has already been informed of this problem. The resident is to be advised to contact the police and the school directly should the problem continue.
  - hedges on the corner of Sheldrick Rd / Beck Rd need cutting back
  - school sign on the corner of West St and Mill St needs re positioning
  - the driveway shingle on several houses needs retaining within boundaries
  - footpaths 2, 4, 5 & 9 need cutting back

DB stated that extensive risk assessments had been undertaken in the recent past and that the 7m high safety nets were deemed to be appropriate in reducing the risks to an acceptable level.

#### 17-18/135 ALLOTMENT MATTERS

The clerk reported that 81% of Dunstall allotments and 40% of 3 Trees allotments are now occupied. After rent is paid to CCC and a 50% contribution made to the Dunstall Charity this leaves a current income of just £268. DB stressed the importance of maintaining both sites to enable the Parish to meet its obligations regarding public availability to allotments. It was noted that allotment rents have not increased for at least 3 years and that they were believed to be cheaper that those charged by other local Parishes. It was therefore proposed by DB and seconded by BM to increase the 2017-18 rents to £15 per 10 rod plot.
