he Isleham Under Fives Association has used several names (Playgroup, Parent/Toddlers etc.) since Margaret Cornell started it in 'The Old Dairy' in Little London over 34 years ago.

It has moved its location several times too, to venues such as the Village Hall and Limestone Close. In 1986, a major change occurred when a purposebuilt building was erected adjacent to the school near to Malting Lane. An enormous amount of fund raising and practical work was required for such an undertaking and many people were involved in making the dream into a reality.

Later, that building was relocated to where the new building stands today, releasing the vacated area as a car park for the school.

The names of those involved over the years in helping to run this organisation may be unfamiliar to some today; they include Margaret Cornell, Barbara Murfitt, who was also on the area committee, Brenda Morley, Janet Ayres, Gill Aspland, Ruth Kitely, Mary Downey, Linda Chandler, Angela Wells, Pauline Wilkes and many more.

Those who are currently engaged in the IUFA appreciate the support of parents, families, friends and village people who have enabled this new building to be erected. It's a long way from a room in a house in Little London!



Planning Boundary Consultation

ue to changes in planning law and procedures which are arising with the new Government, all levels of planning administration are being affected. One of the key controlling documents affecting Isleham is called the Local Development Framework (LDF), which is soon to be revised by East Cambridgeshire District Council (ECDC). As a prelude to this revision, Isleham Parish Council (IPC) wishes to consult with Isleham land owners, to understand their wishes for future long-term land development within the parish.

A consultation process has been established to review and consider possible development areas as a 10-year strategy. Applications for land to be moved inside the planning boundary will be considered by IPC, who will then make a recommendation to ECDC. Should any recommendation be accepted in full or in part then the planning envelope for Isleham could be redrawn. IPC views the strategy as long term and it does not automatically infer the granting of any permission. Any subsequent application outside this process for planning boundary modification may have to wait until the next consultation occurs.

Applications should consist of a map outlining the area of ownership with a signed and dated statement that the applicant is the land owner and they wish the land to be considered by IPC for planning envelope matters. The application should be addressed to Mrs Diane Bayliss, Clerk to the Council, 37 Croft Road, Isleham.

Applications must be received by 18th March 2011; IPC will make any recommendation to ECDC mid-April 2011.

The caravan parked on Little London Drove was reported to the Police.

ICA

The ICA management committee met on 26th October. A letter has been sent to all the interest groups regarding the forthcoming questionnaire (a copy of this was sent by email to all councillors last week); the questionnaire must be returned to the Clerk as previously discussed.

SCHOOL

The matter of a new school for Isleham was raised and JP confirmed that he would fully support a request from IPC to the County Council that they consider the need for a new school in Isleham and, although there is currently no funding available, it is necessary to get the ball rolling.

RECREATION GROUND MATTERS

- 1. A dozen slabs have been laid at the entrance to the new MUGA at a cost of £200 by Rod Billet.
- 2. Bloor Homes will be erecting a sales cabin 30' x 12' on the recreation ground under the terms agreed at the last meeting
- 3. As it is the wrong time of year to re-seed the area, it was agreed that Tim Wilding is asked to rope off the old All Weather with thick stakes and tape.
- 4. Mrs Malkin and the Clerk visited Barcham Trees last week and it was agreed that two Hornbeams will be ordered to fill in the gaps at the edge of the recreation ground. SP Landscapes will plant the trees at a cost of £250 + VAT and maintain them as required for the first year at a cost of £20 per week.
- 5. Work on the new MUGA has been completed and it will be open for use this week. The new security system is in place and all users will be notified of the appropriate code for their booking.
- 6. There are a number of issues that need addressing by Cambridge Courts and £5,000 of the final payment has been withheld until these matters are addressed. A meeting will be held to discuss this.
- 7. It was agreed that Mrs Badcock is allowed to take her vehicle onto the recreation ground in order that she can watch her son play football. The Youth Football Club will be asked to ensure that no other vehicles are allowed onto the ground.
- 8. It was proposed by SB and seconded by JM that £10,000 is set aside for the proposed skate park at the recreation ground. The money will be earmarked for a maximum of three years before being reconsidered if the work has not commenced at that point.
- 9. The grant payment of £50,000 has been received from WREN (Waste Recycling Environmental Group) towards the cost of the new MUGA.

CEMETERY & CHURCHYARD MATTERS

The Beech Tree will be removed on Monday 6th December.

ISLEHAM PARISH PLAN

A second plastic recycling container is to be placed on Coates Drove.

Concerns about cars parking on the grass verges opposite the school are still being considered and County Highways will be contacted to see if planting or fencing these areas would interfere with the visibility splays for Croft Road. It was agreed that £250 is made available towards the cost of hiring a digger to dredge the pond on East Fen Road.

The Parish Council will continue to support the Dial-a-Ride Bus Service and will review it again in 6 months. They also support the increase in fares suggested by ESDAR. The Council are unable to consider a further donation for the work of Dial-a-Ride at this time.

The Council are unable to give donations to the work of Victim Support or MAGPAS, as there is no budgetary provision for this.

It was agreed that the precept is provisionally set at \$89,900 for the financial year 2011–12.

ALLOTMENT MATTERS

It was agreed that the Council approve the quotation from Ian Cowan for £1,020 to install a borehole on the Dunstall Allotment using monies from the Dunstall Charity Fund.

OPEN FORUM

Patrick Pearce asked whether the New Community Centre would be self-sustaining and also whether it was planning to have a full-time bar open, as this would potentially affect the pubs in the village. The Chairman replied that the Centre should be self-sustaining and that it was not the intention of the Council or the ICA that the Centre should adversely affect any of the other businesses in the village.

ICA

A number of points have been raised by people objecting to the proposed council tax increase to help pay towards the cost of the new centre. These will be taken into account when the proposal is discussed at the January meeting.

BLOOR HOMES

Mr Beckett and the Clerk met with representatives from Bloor Homes and the cabin will be erected on the recreation ground this week. Part of the barrier will be removed and a parking space will be reserved for visitors. The recreation ground will be restored to its current state when the cabin is removed in June 2011. A sign will be placed on the Fordham Road advertising the site. The site rent will be paid 3 monthly in advance.

CEMETERY MATTERS

The work has been carried out to the remaining lime trees as previously agreed. It was agreed that a new tree is purchased to replace the Beech in the Old Cemetery as soon as possible. It was also agreed that £600 is set aside for planting and maintenance of the tree for the first year.

CORRESPONDENCE

A letter has been received from Soham Town Council requesting that Isleham Parish Council join at a community event to celebrate the Olympics on 27th July 2012. The

general feeling of the Council was that they would prefer to hold their own event in Isleham.

HIGHWAYS/FOOTPATH MATTERS

It is uncertain who is responsible for repairing the footpath at the side of no. 2 Church Street; the Clerk will try to clarify the legal position with CPALC. A letter has been received from Stephen Moir regarding the boundary at Isleham Marina. It was agreed that the request be forwarded to the Local Government Boundary Commission for England. An enquiry has been made to County Highways about having a 'gateway' into the village on the Fordham Road. The cost would have to be met entirely by the Parish Council and would be approximately £2,500. It was agreed that two members would meet with a representative from Highways to discuss the possible siting of such a scheme. A complaint has been received from a parishioner about the speed bump outside the village hall. Gavin Wiseman from County Highways has inspected the site and can find nothing that needs addressing at the moment.

A Housing Needs survey has been sent out to every home in the village by Cambridgeshire ACRE in conjunction with ECDC.

Steven Baines addressed the Council regarding possible changes to the development boundary in the village and the need for an affordable housing site outside of the boundary.






