elp to produce a 'Vision' for your village.
East Cambridgeshire District Council is looking for your views on how your village/parish should change or improve in the future. What sort of place would you like Isleham to be? What are your priorities for the village and the wider parish? For example, do you want more school places, better local facilities, new homes or more employment opportunities?

The District Council wants to work in partnership with local people and the Parish Council to draw up a long-term Vision for Isleham. The Vision will set out how Isleham should develop/improve over the next 20 years. It will look at issues such as:

- local housing needs
- employment opportunities
- sites for development
- the quality of the local environment
- infrastructure and facilities whether to protect and/or improve.

The Vision will be used to guide decisions on future development and planning applications. It will also help ensure that key infrastructure and facilities are retained and enhanced. The Vision will be included in the statutory development plan for East Cambridgeshire - known as the 'Core Strategy'.

A questionnaire will be available for people's comments from 27th June 2011. The questionnaire can be viewed on the District Council's website at www/eastcambs.gov.uk/core-strategy-review; or paper copies can be obtained by phoning the Forward Planning team on 01353 665555. The website will also have questionnaires for other settlements in East Cambridgeshire (which you are welcome to fill out), as well as other background documents.

Comments should be returned by 18th July 2011.

The District Council is keen to get your views, and would like as many people to get involved as possible. Your comments will help to shape a draft Vision for Isleham. The draft Vision will be published early next year, when there will be a further opportunity to make comments. The final Vision should be published in late 2012, and should hopefully reflect the needs and priorities of the local community.

17th March – At short notice, one of our village residents, Architect David Alberry-King gave an illustrated slide show entitled "East Meets West" in which he compared the two communities of Isleham with St. Kilda which is the name given to group of three main islands located in the Atlantic Ocean in the middle of the Gulf Stream. The Isle of Hirta was the only one of the group that was inhabited - the last inhabitants were evacuated in August 1930. It became a National Trust property in 1956 and a world-wide heritage institute in 1987. It is now home to thousands of puffins, fulmars and gannets. 21st April - The AGM The chairman, Vernon Place reported on the activities and meetings over the last year and thanked all who had given their support in making our year a successful and interesting one. Our membership is being maintained and we have many non-members who are always welcome additions to our meetinas.

There had been little activity on the CCAN website, however, we do have material we can include and would value support from anyone who is interested in preserving the history of our village on the World Wide Web.

Several photos relating to our village have been received by the Society, all of which were allowed to be copied, with the originals being returned. We have also dealt with enquiries regarding people's past relatives or friends.

Michael Kelly and Vernon Place have been involved with the project regarding evacuees and the Jews coming to this area – Mike Rouse has written a play about the evacuation for Viva (Soham) to perform plus there will be a display of photos etc. (hopefully coming to Isleham and other venues).

Vernon Place attended the Annual Parish Meeting to report on the Society's activities during the past year. Appreciation was expressed for the help given by Clive Patterson for entries of our activities into the village website.

The committee was elected as follows: President – Arthur Houghton, Chairman – Vernon Place, Vice Chairman – Peter Flatt, Secretary - Mrs Rosemarie Evans, Treasurer – Bryan Wynn, Programme Secretary – Mrs Betty Ashley, plus Committee members Mrs Barbara Brown, Mrs Pam Martin, Mrs Beryl Powys and Ian Powys.

A special mention was made regarding the 100th Birthday of our President Arthur Houghton later this year.

After the AGM an interesting talk was give by Editor Ed Mayall on "**Producing and Publishing the Informer**". He illustrated the progress of the publication since its inception and emphasised how it much relied upon support of the sponsors and the contributions of reports from the various village organisations plus those who helped in the production and distribution of the magazine. He was thanked by the Chairman for his talk and his work as Editor.

The evening was rounded off with refreshments provided by the members.

19th May: This talk was the one planned for 17th March, which had to be postponed. "Isleham Air Crash - 13th October 1949" An illustrated talk by Stewart Evans and Guy Bettley-Cook. They described how a USAF B50 Superfortress (similar to the pictured above) on a training mission to Heligoland in the Baltic Sea took off from a foggy Lakenheath at 0930 and shortly later came down in a field to the north of Beck Road.

The crash resulted in the detonation of the aircraft's payload of sixteen 500 lb bombs, killing all 12 crew and shattering windows and cracking plaster throughout Isleham. Fortuitously, the blast was directed away from the village and no-one on the ground was injured, despite the crash site being barely half a mile from the village centre. Stewart and Guy speculated, from (often contradictory) eye-witness accounts and research into the safety records of B50s, that the crash followed an engine fire.

The evening concluded with memories of villagers, from the horror and excitement of those in the school at the time, to the relief of the Aves twins that the explosion they heard was not a tyre bursting on the tractor-load of sugarbeet they were taking to the station!





ICA REPORT

A meeting has been held with the Architect and the Quantity Surveyor. Final amendments to the plans have been agreed and drawings are to be drawn up so that the project might be put out to tender. It was agreed that Steve Baines and Rosie Thompson will meet to discuss the details of any lease agreement to be put in place with the ICA. It was agreed in principal to lease the centre to the ICA however this will need to be ratified at a later date once the lease documents have been properly considered.

CEMETERY AND CHURCHYARD MATTERS

It was agreed that the oak bench that was in the old cemetery will be kept in the cemetery shed (after restoration by Sid) until the new community centre is built when it will be sited on the recreation ground or in the garden area.

It was proposed that a London Plane tree is purchased for the Old Cemetery to replace the Beech due to resistance to the Ustulina deusta fungus.

COUNTY AND DISTRICT COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

There was no report from the County Council. A negative verbal response was received from the County Council regarding the plans for a new school for the village; however, the matter will continue to be pursued.

HIGHWAYS/FOOTPATH MATTERS

County Highways have confirmed that the Parish Council would not be responsible should there be an accident on the footpath outside No 2 Church Lane. Budgets allowing, in the new financial year the kerbs and footway outside 34 Beck Road will be raised. If the parish council wish to have anything more substantial done they should contact Gavin Wiseman or Kevin Hall at the County Council. It was agreed that the PC would approach the County Council with a view to possibly having a railing along the road and that Beck Road is added to the gritting network.

Mrs Wilkes will ask the school for a letter asking the PC to support their application for a railing on Malting Lane; under the new localism agenda, it may be possible to source the work locally and get it approved by the County Council, keeping the cost down.

It was agreed that an advert shall be placed in the *Informer* and on the Notice Board advertising for a Litter Collector for 5 hours per week at £7 per hour. Small maintenance jobs will continue to be carried out by Mr Cox and Mr Wilding.
