

We keep the pigs outside for most of the year, whilst in winter months or depending on the weather, some of sows may come inside to farrow (give birth) and then return outside when their piglets are strong enough.

By allowing them to mature slowly outdoors, this helps the meat to develop a gentle marbling and gives the pork its superb flavour and, when roasted, it remains succulent and tender.

# Community Centre Update

Another major step towards the start of the build!

have now received approval for the public works loan and the Section 106 monies £87,752 have also been approved; these two funds give a significant boost to the total needed for the build.



Total funds raised to date stand at over £1.2M, which is well on the way to the £1.4M target.

To save money on the initial tender prices, the Parish Council/ICA quantity surveyor and architect worked on the plans; there are no significant changes to the footprint of the building. Most savings were made reducing paving, by specifying different materials, alternative finishes to some internal walls and removing some of the fancy bits internally.

Following the public meeting held in January, we hope that everyone is aware that the tender process has now finished, with the preferred builder being CJ Murfitts. We are now working with CJ Murfitts finalising minor points of the build.

With the tender process complete and a huge amount of time and effort from the grant seeking team (led by Tim Washtell), they have now been able to submit three major grant applications. Grant seeking is an on-going process and will continue even when building has started.

Oxford Archaeology are looking to commence site investigations in the week commencing the 21st May for one week, so as you read this the archaeological surveys should have been completed. Whilst the expected start date at present is September 2012 this may change if the archaeologists find buried treasure or similar. Mind you if treasure is found it may pay for some, or all, of the new centre!

If there are no hold ups in the build it is hoped the centre will be open by the Spring/Summer of 2013. Oakley's will be carrying out the ground investigations and are likely to start these at the end of May (exact dates to be confirmed). So don't be concerned if you notice people digging holes in the area of the new build.

The village hall is still planned to be demolished 20 weeks before the end of the project (40 week build time) to allow for essential services to be routed through to the new centre avoiding the tree roots. The exact date of closure will be announced when a firm date has been agreed for the start of the build. Local groups will be notified of the hall closure and with the help of the Parish Council should be able to make temporary alternative arrangements

# From the Vicar...

s I write, the hosepipe ban has brought the rain, the heating remains in the 'on' position and I'm wearing boots with socks, not sandals or pumps, and I've yet to enjoy any asparagus! So we can celebrate that the English summer has well and truly arrived. And what a summer it will be! I for one am very excited about the Olympics (seems to me it's time for fun and celebrations) and the Jubilee will bring its own sense of community celebrations and thanksgiving to our Monarch and Supreme Head of the Church of England. It is set to be a summer of red, white and blue; and gold, silver and bronze.

In our churches this summer we will be celebrating and praying for Her Majesty; as we give thanks for her 60 years as defender of the faith. It is a remarkable achievement, for anyone to be so dedicated and so tireless in their work. As a Diocese and as a parish we have all signed and sent a 'Great Big Thank You' card to the Queen, as a sign of our gratitude. Her role as defender of the faith and Supreme Governor of the Church of England is as you can perhaps imagine a huge task and a real responsibility – also as head of the Church it does rather make you wonder why all the fuss about Women Bishops; but I suspect that debate is for another time!

In our parish we are also celebrating a record 35 weddings this year (in some churches several on one day – any brides reading this please don't be late!). In each marriage service we pray that the couple's love may be a 'seal upon their hearts and a crown upon their heads' (indeed in the Orthodox Churches Brides and Grooms do wear crowns). This summer let us celebrate our weddings, our Olympic Glory and our Queen's Reign, and whether we dress up or not, let us wear our crowns of love – love for each other and love for God. And do join us in Church as we give thanks for what looks set to be a great summer of fun and celebration (whatever the weather!).

#### **Police Matters**

- PCSO Matt Chennell has taken over the south area of East Cambs and he is the point of contact for Isleham.
- There were a number of thefts from garages and sheds during March; however, these seem to have now ceased.
- Parking outside the school is an ongoing problem and the PCSO will be monitoring this more regularly and issuing tickets where appropriate.
- Please be aware that recently padlocks have been superglued on Humans Drove and police are looking for the prepatrators.

#### Village Hall Report

• The village hall floor has been professionally cleaned by Stainbusters. There are a number of light fittings not working in the hall – unfortunately it is unlikely that these can be repaired although they will be looked at by an electrician in the next couple of weeks.

#### **Recreation Ground Report**

 Following the inspection and risk assessment by Wicksteed the baby cradle swings have had to be removed. As a temporary measure two of the bigger swings will be removed and replaced with two cradle swings.

#### **ICA Report**

- The archaeological survey was due to be carried out during May along with other soil investigations.
- Borrowing Approval has been granted by the DCLG. The loan will be taken out during the next year from the Public Works Loan Board.
- Section 106 monies of £87,752 have been awarded to the project by ECDC.
- A grant application has been submitted to the Football Foundation and was well received at the initial meeting. A final decision will be made on 29th May.

#### **Cemetery and Churchyard Matters**

• The quotation for re-painting the railings around the War Memorial from Mr Wilding was approved by the Council. Some work to the coping stones will be carried out before this work can be done.



• A memorial bench is to be placed on The Pound by the family of Professor Lesley Audus on Saturday 9th June.

#### **Financial Matters**

• The Internal Audit report has been completed and no issues have been raised for consideration. It is likely that an interim audit will be required in December if building commences at the end of the summer.

#### **Policy Review**

- The Child Protection Policy has been updated and an Equal Opportunities Policy was approved by the Council.

- The council objected to the planning application at 3 Hall Barn Road, Isleham.
- Planning approvals were received for Karma Farm; 26 Hall Barn Road; 18 Prickwillow Road.
- A planning refusal was received for 45 West Street.
- Planning Applications are available for viewing on the East Cambs District Council Website or an appointment can be made with the Parish Clerk.

#### Street Lighting

- Balfour Beatty is in the process of replacing the street lighting throughout Cambridgeshire over the next several years. There will be 10% fewer lights; however, the new white light source will be brighter therefore the impact on the street will not be great. There is no more detailed information at the moment.


