ocal resident Brian Challis recently days as a volunteer Games Maker at the London 2012 Olympic Games. Brian's role was as a NOC (National Olympic Committee) Assistant, based in the Athletes' village at Stratford working with Team USA. His tasks included driving, administration duties, athletes.

Final rehearsal for the Opening Ceremony

Games Makers were not returned home after spending 35 paid expenses, or provided with accommodation – Brian stayed the 5 weeks with his daughter and son-in-law in South London. He acknowledges the support his wife Corrine gave to enable him to be a Games Maker, which took up all of his annual leave plus many Saturdays and generally helping American since January for training, meaning no holiday this year he says.

> Brian originally registered to be a Games Maker back in November 2008, and after an interview in June 2011. he was offered a role in November 2011. He then had to go to London on ten occasions for various training sessions before commencing his duties on 12th July.

Among his many highlights he lists driving Team USA's Chief Security Officer around on many days, escorting Team USA's Athletes to the Stadium for the Opening Ceremony on 27th July, and just rubbing shoulders with elite athletes on a daily basis. Along with other Games Makers he also took part in the final Opening Ceremony rehearsal on 25th July, as a parading athlete!

He was also invited to lunch with the Athletes' Village Mayor, Sir Charles Allan, after being nominated by "someone" as a Games Maker having "gone the extra mile", and had the opportunity to hold Gold, Silver and Bronze Olympic Medals.

However despite all of those memorable experiences, he says the one thing that stands out was on the night of the Opening Ceremony when he unexpectedly bumped into his daughter Kika (who has worked for LOCOG for over 6 years) outside the Olympic Stadium, and being able to share with her the moment she and her colleagues had been working so hard towards for so long.

Overall Brian says being part of the Olympic Games was a surreal experience, and a truly "once in a lifetime opportunity".

just them, but Christ who dwells within them. As we are made in the image of God, it is God who is love dwelling in our hearts – our challenge is to see the face of God in all who we meet.

So, God has called me elsewhere and I leave you with thanks and I know that along with Mike and Jenny the church will always be a place where all are welcome, and where everyone can find a spiritual home. I do hope you can join me for my formal farewell on 28th October at 10.30am at Fordham Church, followed by lunch at the Victoria Hall. All are welcome!

As for me I know it will be bitter sweet – I'll be wearing waterproof mascara!

Update: Planned traveller's site Isleham Road, Fordham

s many of you are aware East Cambs District Council (ECDC) have earmarked land between Isleham and Fordham for two new gypsy and traveller sites in their Local Development Plan, a plan that many Isleham and Fordham residents strongly oppose.

Following two meetings, one in Isleham and one in Fordham, both of which were extremely well attended by residents from both villages, the news came from Katie Child, ECDC Principal Forward Planning Officer, that the land owner of one of the sites is no longer willing to sell the site for traveller site development, although ECDC did stress that they were yet to receive this information in writing.

However, the second site proposed to be located adjacent to the above site, is still on ECDC's list of identified Traveller Site possibilities and although ECDC have indicated that the site may not meet the specifications required, it has yet to be formally removed from ECDC's plans. This matter will be debated by councillors at the Development and Transport Committee in early November.

Residents were strongly encouraged by our local councillors, Joshua Schumann and Michael Allen, to continue to write to Katie Childs at ECDC with material planning objections matched to relevant points in the Local Development Framework. For copies of the documents please refer to the Isleham website under 'Isleham Vision'. On the website you will also find a PDF copy of an example objection letter should you wish to express your views to ECDC.

SeedSava comes with a base section, four hoppers with differing hole sizes, a lid and easy to follow illustrated instructions. The hoppers are numbered and colour coded to suit the variations in seed sizes.

The selected hopper clips into and slides gently a short way along the base. When the holes in the hopper line up with the holes in the base the seeds drop through on to the ground in the desired position, then simply move the device along by its own length and repeat. Any surplus seeds can be easily returned to their packet for use later in the season or the following year.



Post Office News

e would like to inform the village community of Isleham, that the contract we currently have with DVLA (Driver Vehicle Licensing Authority), is up for renewal by the government, which could mean that if we do not meet the required number of car taxes we do at the post office, we could lose this valuable service.

We would like to express our general concerns, with regards to the ever-decreasing customer numbers who use the Post Office at Isleham. We felt that the best way to do this is by an article in the local Isleham Informer.

We would like to make it known to the village community that we need more customer support; otherwise the future looks bleak. We cannot afford to lose any more valuable services like this one, and unless customer support picks up for us, then we will have no option but to consider the future of the Post Office here.

We have seen a dramatic decrease in our Post Office salary over the last four years, and with services continually being taken away from us, it is a struggle to survive as a financially viable business. We have had to take on additional work behind the scenes, operating an eBay and customer website, which sometimes causes a little confusion with customers coming in to find lan not at the post office counter. He is more often than not attending additional duties elsewhere, and not putting his feet up having a coffee!

We have also taken on a pet sitting/dog walking service, to again supplement our income.

We appeal to customers who are tempted to carry out all their transactions online (i.e. by going direct debit, using couriers instead of Royal Mail, getting a franking machine, paying their car tax online, getting their Euros online) to reconsider the affect this is having on the survival of their Post Office; after all, it has been part of the village community for many years now!

On a last note, we should like to add, that although

we are up for sale, doesn't mean we have closed our doors to business! This is still a Post Office, with a shop and newsagent, so please don't give up on us just yet. We feel that the "For Sale" sign most probably has caused a lot of unsettlement from our customers, who have been worried about the future of the Post Office. And yes, we have been on the market now for two years, (18 months as a business, and currently up for residential/ semi-commercial as a house.) We cannot tempt buyers to take on the business, if we do not have the customer support that we desperately need!

So please give us the support we need, so that the future of the Post Office here is secure!



Since the last *Informer* the ICA and the Parish Council have been hard at work trying to keep the build on track. One minor set back has been with the archaeologists wanting to investigate the whole building foot-print. Whilst this could have caused severe delays to the start of the build it wasn't as bad as expected. However, the proposed excavation has raised a few other problems; these have been taken on by the team who have come up with excellent ideas to help keep the build on track with only a minor delay to the start. Taking these into account it would now look like a October/November start by our main contractor, but please keep in mind there are a lot of factors that can affect this date.

The legal issues relating to the management of the new centre have resulted in the Parish Council and ICA management committee creating a lease for the centre and the formation of a management company with Parish Councillors, ICA, user-group members and trustees. 25th July - A coach visit to the 'Sandringham Flower Show'. On an extremely hot day we visited one of the most prestigious horticultural events in the East of England. Many of the region's nurseries were exhibiting, in addition there were many show gardens displayed by leading designers plus some 200 trade stands, a craft marquee and arena entertainment. The main area featured the RAF Tigers Parachute Display Team, Motorcycle Display Team, Essex Dog Display Team, a Gymnastics display, Heavy Horses and a Marching Display by a Military Band. In addition to our coach party, Prince Charles and Camilla visited the Show and it it was also good to meet Brian and Janice Pope who had recently moved away from the village. A worthwhile and enjoyable day. August - No meeting.

20th September – A guided tour of the 'Theatre Royal' Bury St Edmunds with afternoon tea. Facts from their information booklet: "Built in 1819, this Grade 1 listed playhouse is the only surviving example of a Regency theatre in this country. It is the only theatre open to the public in the National Trust's portfolio of properties. Now fully restored its extraordinarily intimate auditorium and exquisite decorative scheme will provide visitors with an unforgettable and unique theatrical experience Greene King, the local brewery, purchased the freehold, which

it still owns, in 1920. However, in 1925, in the face of overwhelming competition from two new cinemas, the Theatre Royal closed once more. Greene King struggled to keep the theatre in operation but was now content to use the building as a barrel store. So it remained until the 1960's when a group of local people led by Air Vice Marshall Stanley Vincent raised over £37,000 to restore and re-open the Theatre Royal in 1965. The building was vested in the National Trust in 1975 on a 999 year lease. The Theatre Royal is now managed as an independent working theatre by the Bury St Edmunds Theatre Management Limited".

We were split into two groups for our excellent guides to relate the history of this wonderful little theatre as we were shown behind the scenes and allowed to stand on the stage. Some of our members are going to a show there next week – we saw some of the cast rehearing for it!

NHS Information @ GPs to be Cambridgeshire trialed in Ely practices Developing Good Ne



are Network Cambridgeshire has just launched a new service called 'Information@GPs'. The service aims to give information to patients in their GP practices. The NHS is funding Care Network to provide information in nine of the Isle of Ely Health consortium surgeries until March 2013.

Care Network's Senior Coordinator Hilary Johns said, 'We'd heard from GP's that they have found it impossible to know the vast range of voluntary and other organisations in Cambridgeshire which could be beneficial to their patients. Information@GPs, will make available information on: help in the home; transport; support groups and social clubs; keeping safe and secure, and how to get advice on finances and benefits. But we will try to help with anything - or signpost patients to people who can.' She added, 'As it's a pilot project we'll be able to see what the actual need is, but we begun receiving requests for information before the service officially started.' 'We believe that GPs, practice staff and patients will all benefit from this new service.'

The service is available now at Burwell, Haddenham, Stretham, Chatteris, Littleport, Soham, Sutton, and the

two Ely surgeries once a week. An appointment can be booked with the receptionist at the patient's own surgery, or by calling one of the information officers on 07436 263347/8. Home visits are available to people who are unable to get to the surgeries.



Police Matters

- New Contact Number for Police 101
- There is still a problem with parking around the village including outside the school, at the top of Limestone Close and on the yellow lines outside the Co-op. Please be considerate of pedestrians and other road users when parking your vehicles in the village.
- The next Neighbourhood Panel meeting will be held at Soham Village College on Wednesday 10th October at 7pm.

Village Hall Report

- There has been a problem obtaining light fittings and bulbs for the hall; it is hoped that this problem can be remedied before the nights draw in.
- The village hall will be closing 20 weeks before the end of the building of the new centre. This is likely to be next March/April and the Council will give as much notice as possible.

Recreation Ground Report

- The MUGA is available to hire during the day and at weekends – please contact the Clerk for more details.
- The Recreation Ground is very well used and maintained.
 A number of remedial works will be carried out this autumn including fertilising the grass and cutting back the hedges.

ICA Report

- The Council are still awaiting the final tender price from C J Murfitt and the outcome of a further grant application.
- A lease agreement is being drawn up between IPC and the Isleham Community Association (ICA)
- A further archaeological dig must take place before building can commence.

Cemetery and Churchyard Matters

- It has been agreed that the Council will look into replacing the hedge on the right hand side of the cemetery adjacent to the new development.
- The Council has purchased a leaf blower to help with maintenance at the cemetery.

Dog Fouling

 A number of dog bins have been installed around the village although there are still a number of incidents of dog fouling. The dog warden can be contacted on 01353 665555 or you can file a report on the website www.eastcambs.gov.uk

Highways Matters

- It has been an exceptionally rainy season and as a consequence the normal grass cutting schedule has been insufficient. A contingency for future years will be considered when the contract comes up for renewal.
- There still seems to be some confusion over who is responsible for hedges and footpaths. The Council is trying to get a clear answer on this from the County Council.
- The Parish Plan working group met and discussed plans for the telephone kiosks. It has been agreed that the one on Mill Street will be turned into an information point and the one on The Causeway will be a book swap.

Allotment Matters

- A portion of the Dunstall Allotment Land has been set aside to be used as a Community Orchard – for further details please contact Mrs Jeanette Malkin 01638 780283
- There are still a number of allotments for rent on Station Road and Beck Road. Please contact the Clerk for further details
- The Council have agreed to keep allotment rents the same for the forthcoming year.
- Allotment Rents will be collected in the Village Hall on Monday 15th October. Please take the opportunity to come along and raise any issues you may have to do with allotments.

Planning Matters

- Isleham Vision is underway and there will be a public consultation in November/December of this year. For more details please contact the Clerk.
- The Council strongly objected to a proposal for a traveller site on Isleham Road Fordham. Approximately 140 people including Parish Councillors, District Councillors and County Councillors attended the September Parish Council meeting to express their objections. There will be a meeting of the Development and Transport Committee on 6th November (time and venue to be arranged) and the public are encouraged to attend to express their views.
- Planning approvals were received for 14 Robins Close and 8 Limestone Close.
- Planning Applications are available for viewing on the East Cambs District Council Website or an appointment can be made with the Parish Clerk.

Street Lighting

- Balfour Beatty is in the process of replacing the street lighting throughout Cambridgeshire over the next several years. The Parish Council will be consulted on the process and residents will be sent information a few weeks before work begins.
- If your street light is not working please contact the Parish Clerk with the light number, she will then report it to the County Council.

The Parish Council continues to support the Ely/Soham Dial-a-Ride Bus Service to Ely on a Thursday morning and the Fenland Elite Youth Bus, which visits The Priory on a Thursday evening (term time only). ■
