

Police officer fuels charity projects

An Ely youth group will be presented with new sports equipment thanks to a local police officer.

The pool cues with accompanying care kit Cambridgeshire were presented to the Garage Youth Project,

which is run from the Lighthouse Centre in Ely, by PC Steve Hinks on 26th February.

Creating a safer

The equipment was purchased thanks to a fuel card scheme run by PC Hinks, in which police vehicles using filling stations in Cambridgeshire can collect Nectar points at BP as well as Texaco, Shell, Tesco, Sainsbury's and Morrisons stores reward schemes.

When enough points are accrued, PC Hinks uses them to buy items for good causes.

In 2011, he presented about £400 of new sports equipment to the Darwin Drive Boys group from the Arbury area.

PC Hinks said: "I run the fuel card scheme because it is an ideal way of putting something back into the community. The Garage Youth Project seemed like a very good cause and I'm sure this equipment will help them out.

"I will be looking to donate goods to other worthy causes and groups in future so anyone who wants to be considered should apply to me, stating what they want and why they want it.

If you need social care the County Council will arrange your care for you, but they now have a duty to offer and provide Direct Payments. Direct Payments are an alternative way of getting the care and support you need. They are cash payments made directly into a Direct Payment bank account so that you can use the money to make your own social care arrangements.

With a Direct Payment you have more choice, control and independence about how your care is organised. 

Community Centre – Building on firm Foundations

Tith the weather holding out this update on the Community Centre sees steady progress on the build.

During January the highways entrance was rebuilt (by C J Murfitts) to meet regulations and enable a sound access to the site.

Finishing off January and into February saw removal of the turf and topsoil to make way for hardcore, which now forms access to the building site. The site office and other Portakabins were also placed onsite allowing the contractors to establish their operations centre.

Continuing into March and with the weather holding out, good progress was made in laying the concrete foundations. All seems to be on track – our monthly site progress meeting saw reports of 8% completion, which meets our current timescales.

March saw the completion of the foundations and the start of the erection of the steelwork. There was also a press announcement in the Newmarket Journal praising the 6 years of hard work and thanks to the major grant providers for their support.

There is still a lot to do and work continues in the background, this includes continued monitoring of the build progress, further fund raising, grant seeking, and management infrastructure such as Centre working documents.

A Facebook page has also been set up to track progress of the build. This incorporates a timeline with many old photographs of events from the old village hall as we don't want to forget the good times that have been had.

Some time back a decision was made by the ICA to arrange an event to remember the many years of service the old village hall has given the village. It was felt that all age groups should have a chance to celebrate the old village hall. This has culminated in four events being planned for the last two Saturdays in April.

The events are:

- 20th April 5.30–7.30pm Children's Disco Primary School ages children, up to 12 years £2 entry, including unlimited squash and a packet of crisps
- 20th April 8–11pm Teenage Disco (under 18s) £3 entry - Soft drinks will be available (no alcohol)

Friends of Isleham Nature Reserves

Regular visitors to the railway reserve will have seen some significant management work this winter. Encroaching scrub



has been cut back to create more space to allow chalk grassland plants to re-colonise, and overhanging branches lopped along much of the track to allow in more light. We hope that eventually the cleared areas will develop some of the attractive diversity of plants that currently occur only in small areas of the reserve, and which provide food for butterflies and moths, as well as a nectar and pollen source for pollinators such as solitary bees and bumblebees. Some piles of brush and trimmings have been left as cover for small mammals, as well as for grass snakes and lizards which are quite frequently seen on the reserve. We have stripped the top soil from a couple of small areas as an experiment to see whether removing this nutrient rich layer of soil will hasten the appearance of the less competitive plants such as scabious and vetches.

Elsewhere in Isleham, members of the group have been active in helping establish the new community orchard (see an account of this project in this issue of the *Informer*). The first phase of work on Isleham village pond on East Fen Road has been completed – the tree has been trimmed and the pond has been dredged. We await some rain and spring sunshine before the next phase of planting. Cambridge and Peterborough Environmental Records Centre held a frog and toad hunt in the village on 9th March, starting at the pond. Led by Jane Andrews-Gauvain, the Biological Outreach Officer of the Records Centre the "Friends" group has been taking part in a number of surveys of different types of wildlife over the past year, to get a better understanding of the diversity of wildlife in and around the village.

We are interested in finding out how many people have ponds in the village, and whether you had any frogs, toads or newts this spring. Please let us know by phone or our Facebook page.

We now have a good range of collecting equipment and identification guides which we would be happy to share with anyone interested in finding out more about local wildlife. Work has also been carried out at Isleham Wash, which we hope will help attract more breeding waders and perhaps other wetland birds (you'll see that a floating "tern platform" has been installed).

We will be holding our AGM on 15th April (in St Andrews Church social centre) at 7.30pm. This will include short talks about local wildlife and we will set out our plans for the year. Please do come along to our AGM if you'd like to get involved in the group, take part in some or all of the activities mentioned above or just to find out who we are.

The Isleham Society

17th January – We are indebted to Christopher Goodwins for his report of this meeting:

A talk by Dr Carenza Lewis, on the archaeology digs held at Isleham.

"Hands up, anyone who has ever broken a plate, or dropped a cup?" This was the opening question, to the 60 people who had gathered to hear Dr Carenza Lewis (of Cambridge University Archaeology Department and formerly of Channel 4 Time *Team*). Inevitably, we all raised our hands, as she then told us that, for hundreds of years, people like us have also dropped, and broken, or lost, all sorts of things, which then didn't see the light of day until dug up many years later, by accident, or by design, such as in the archaeological digs that took place here in 2011 and 2012.

About a couple of dozen of these digs took place in Isleham and in Little Isleham, where students from Mildenhall College and several interested adults, meticulously sifted through metre-square plots in back gardens and fields, to see what pottery, metal, bones, oyster shells or other items could be found. The findings from each plot were then painstakingly cleaned, classified and dated, under the supervision of the expert archaeologists on site.

Carenza used a PowerPoint presentation to show us what items had been found locally, and then treated us to a series of slides that showed the distribution of the finds, compared with what had been discovered not only in Isleham but also throughout East Anglia, during several periods of history, from well before the days of the Roman occupation of Britain, right through the Mediaeval period, to the present day.

The evidence very clearly suggested where Isleham people had lived, and what influence devastations such as the Black Death had had on the distribution of people and their houses in and around Isleham. An hour went by so quickly that it left us breathless, wanting to know more and more about this wonderful village and its former inhabitants.

Our hope is that the tremendous enthusiasm generated by the last two years' digs will now become a regular feature of Isleham life, creating a lot of fun, as well as bringing the community together, as we delve into our past history. It was a wonderful evening's talk by Carenza Lewis, introduced by Peter Flatt in the absence of Vernon Place, and summed-up by Ian Powys.

He photographed the inside of Palace House (which is the oldest surviving part of King Charles II's royal residence) both before and after it was restored.

He also visited The Palace House Stables when Bruce Hobbs trained there, who retired in 1985, bringing to an end the use of the yard for training since King Charles II's days. He covered the 'Royal Newmarket' aspects of as he photographed the opening of the Racing Museum by the Queen and the visits by several other Royals over the years. He was also 'Host photographer' for the Queen Mother on two occasions when she visited the town. We were so fortunate to have James Waugh as a visitor; he was
