

¶ly Foodbank opened last November having been ◀ called to serve an area of a 15 mile radius of Ely – including Littleport, Chatteris, March and Soham. Initially, as you may expect, the focus has been the Ely area but the Foodbank has already served more than 300 people from the 2 wards in Soham and several more from the villages in the area, including Isleham. To date, more than 1,500 people have been served by Ely Foodbank (with the equivalent of 15,000 meals)

Local people have been astonishingly generous by buying additional items of food, with more than 15 tonnes having been given in the first eight months! This generosity, the teamwork of the Foodbank's volunteers and considerable development work behind the scenes has led Ely Foodbank to make further significant steps in seeking to fulfil its remit.

A Foodbank, backed by Churches Together in Soham, the Town Council, the Children's Centre and local traders working in partnership with Ely Foodbank (a Trussell Trust Foodbank) opened in Soham on 11th July at the Salvation Army centre in Bushel Lane, Soham. People who are in food crisis are able to collect their food in Soham on production of a Foodbank Voucher on Thursdays 1000 - 1100, or in Ely from The Lighthouse Centre on Tuesday afternoons or from The Forum, in Barton Road on Friday afternoons., so clients can make their choice.

The Foodbanks aim to serve people in food crisis in our local towns and villages, and more Foodbanks (in partnership with Ely Foodbank) are planned in Chatteris and March in the near future. In this way agencies, organisations and all of us as individuals can play our part in working together to ensure that we can look after local people who are going through difficult times, and enable them to get the help they need to get through their crisis with revived hope and dignity restored.

Gifts of non-perishable food, finance and time by volunteers are always needed (and appreciated!)

Have Your Say




he Friends of Isleham Nature Reserves group has been going for several years now and we are keen to expand the range of activities we do and to encourage others to join us. Although we are involved in a range of different wildlife sites and

initiatives in and around Isleham, our main responsibility (by agreement with Cambridgeshire County Council) is the management of the Railway Local Nature Reserve (just outside the village on the Fordham Road – see map) to maintain and improve its attractiveness for wildlife, and to encourage others to use and enjoy it.

We are very aware of the importance of the Reserve for people who want to enjoy a quiet walk or watch some of the wildlife and especially for people exercising their

dogs. As a result the site -including the adjacent chalk field (also marked on the map), which is also managed for wildlife under an Environmental Stewardship Scheme attracts lots of local (and not so local) visitors. We have been discussing improvements to the entrance to the reserve with the County Council; hopefully we'll see some work to make good the track to the car park soon.



We are looking at other ways to improve what we can do for the village and surrounding area, and we would appreciate your filling in the separate questionnaire in the Informer if at all possible. This will help us get a better idea about your concerns and interests. Completed forms can be placed in the box in the Isleham Co-op over the next few weeks.

There will be spare sheets at the Co-op if you forget yours. In the next few months we will be running a Bat Hunt in the evening, also an Astronomy evening when the evenings get dark. Watch out for announcements at the Reserve entrance.



New Deputy Chief Constable "passionate" about policing

ambridgeshire police's new Deputy Chief Constable has said he will not shrink from the difficult issues facing the force in coming years.

Alec Wood, 48, formerly Temporary Deputy Chief Constable for Lincolnshire Police, became deputy to Chief Constable Simon Parr on 27th August.



Creating a safer Cambridgeshire

Mr Wood, who replaces John Feavyour, said, unlike many other forces, the constabulary had identified a clear way of dealing with funding cuts but, like his predecessor, he would be open about the challenges.

He said: "The fundamental purpose of policing is to deliver the best possible service to the public to keep them safe and protect the most vulnerable.

"I am passionate about the service we provide and my role as DCC is to enable the force to provide that service in the most efficient and effective way it can."

Mr Wood said the force's drive to save time and money by making the best use of currently available technology would be vital to meeting the financial challenges it faces.

"We need to do business differently while preserving the front line", he said. "The force's programme to find technological solutions has been properly thought out and I will be looking for ways to support its delivery, making sure it continues to head in the right direction.

"I do not see many other forces with similar funding issues identifying such a clear and transformational way of solving the funding problem and that makes Cambridgeshire Constabulary different."

Mr Wood, who is married with two grown-up children, a daughter and son, was born in Lincoln but his parents quickly moved to Buckden, where they lived for a time before moving to Wyton where he attended Houghton and Wyton Primary School.

"I lived in Cambridgeshire until I was nearly 12 so it has a sense of home and it is still an important county to me.

Mr Wood is the ACPO lead for Behavioural Science. He has an MA in Criminology.
