



Weston's Ramblings

The first in a series (hopefully) of walks around the village by Tony Weston with his dog, Phoebe.

fter a gap in dog ownership we are now fortunate to have a new five month old Chocolate Labrador, Phoebe. She likes walking at 7am and this last Saturday I went on a lovely walk with her that I would like to recommend. It included 31 species of birds.

The starting place is the footbridge over the weir at the Marina. The recent gales have downed many trees and one upstream over the river gave me five minutes with a kingfisher. The flooded Little Wash gave me pied wagtail, greenshank and common sandpiper. No sign of the migrating yellow wagtails. I think they were still on the Big Wash working on the fly hatch with about 50 swallows. The swallows will soon be off to South Africa for the winter. One of the young terns that hatched out on an island we put on the Big Wash passed by noisily fishing. A cormorant was drying its wings in the tree.

The farmland had more than a smattering of young bunnies some of who eyeballed Phoebe. Phoebe didn't see them, luckily.

We walked on up Waterside. Just past Jaylay Lodge our presence upset a wren, which chided us to pass by quickly and then burst into its very loud song. How can something so small produce so many decibels?

Phoebe showed her wild side by shaking a newly demised pigeon. That is better than the cowpats she specialises in eating!

After the allotments we turned right down Coates Drove. Several hares were in the cut cornfield and a green woodpecker showed itself by its trademark 'yaffle' call. Overhead the jackdaws were in squadron formation on the way to the Church. I often think that Isleham's alternative name should be Jackdawville.

A kestrel was eyeing up some golden, red, white and black goldfinches eating thistles. I am led to believe this is an area for little owls.

Past the recycling bins we came to the Prickwillow Road. After rewarding Phoebe for a sit we proceeded straight across and went down the footpath.

Swallows were feeding for their epic migration in the narrow space between the maize and the hedge. In the hedge

and trees there was a dunnock, blackcaps and a greater spotted woodpecker. It must have been a juvenile as it had both red head and backside.

When we got to Little London we turned left towards the

village. Nice topiary and pirate ship! We turned right on to the track off the first bend. A great little piece of parkland with free range chickens usually in the field. No sign of any squirrels. At the end of the track we went straight over to Hall Barn Road and turned left for home.

Phoebe was great, stopping when I looked for birds. She slept well on return.

If you want my bird checklist, give me a ring. Remember it will vary with time of the year.





Like many babies it will probably not always sleep too well and still want to chase Daddy around the royal furniture.

At some point the baby will grow up to realise that they are the son of a King and have a King who knows them and loves them. Although High Street Church loves been a family we also want to know more about King Jesus and his work in our lives. As a church we do our best to follow and continually ask him to be King of our lives. Much of the life of the church is looking at the bible, praying and spending time in worship. This can sound a bit stuffy to some people but it is in some ways what we do with people we love. If I am away from my wife, I will write her letters, they tell her what I am thinking and what I am planning, this sounds like the bible, will talk together, this is prayer and I say how much I love her, which is worship. So perhaps it's not so strange after all.

We join together as a church at 11am and 6.30am on Sundays and throughout the week in different ways and in different size groups. You would be more than welcome to come and join us or just sit back and watch. The doors are open; we hope you will receive a warm royal welcome.
