

# Remembering..... Isleham Poppy Project

11 November 1918 marked the end of World War 1 and with it's 100 year anniversary coming up lots of creative people in Isleham thought it would be a lovely idea to commemorate this milestone by using our talents to create a huge poppy display at St Andrew's Church. Isleham is renowned for its wonderful community spirit so we thought it could also be a celebration this too. Our poppy projects is in full swing and as promised here is a second pattern to help people get involved.

**Knitting Pattern** (with thanks to Deana-Rae Hoey)

4mm needles and have been using Lisa premium from Amazon. TIP= leave long black ends as they can then be used to tie the poppies to the netting or object they will be tied too.

kfb= knit into front and back

skpo= slip one knit one pass slip st over

P2tog= purl 2 together

P3tog= purl 3 together

k2tog= knit 2 together

#### Petals (make 2)

cast on 14sts

row1) kfb knit to last 2 sts kfb k1 (16sts)

row2) kfb knit to last 2 sts kfb k1 (18sts)

row3) kfb knit to last 2 sts kfb k1 (20sts)

row4) purl

row5) k1 skpo k2 repeat to last st k1 (15sts)

row6) purl

row7) skpo k1 repeat to last st k1 (10sts)

row8) p2tog to end (5sts)

cast off

#### Centre

cast on 2 sts

row1) kfb k1 (3sts)

row2) purl

row3) kfb k1 (5sts)

row4) purl

row5) skpo k1 k2tog (3 sts)

row 6) p3tog

fasten off tightly

#### MAKE UP

Petals = sew the two smaller edges together and sew in all the ends

Centre= gather round the outer edge by using the tails and pull tightly to form a ball. sew into place and finish off and pull the black ends through

## Thanks for Supporting Litter Pick the Foodbank!

THANK YOU, FOLKS, FOR CONTINUING TO SUPPORT THE FOODBANK!

Since I started keeping weekly records - from the 8th of September 2014 - of how many items we have given to the local foodbank, it was a complete surprise to discover that you, kind people, have donated over 13,400 items, and also £95 in cash!

This averages out at about 70 items a week, from our local collection points at the three Isleham Churches, the Social Centre, and the Co-op.

Also for the record, and just for interest, I have kept a weekly photographic record of what was donated. Each week, we take the collected items to the Foodbank based at the Soham Salvation Army HO in Bushell Road, where a team of local volunteers approved by the Trussell Trust are ready to weigh it all, assign it to source, and then sort it by use-by date. The items are then boxed-up for delivery to the store at Ely, as there are no appropriate facilities to store donations in Soham.

At Ely they make up bags for single people and for families, containing an appropriate basic selection of goods, which can be topped-up from the day's donations as necessary. These bags are delivered back to Soham for distribution to local recipients from Soham and the surrounding villages. It sounds long-winded, but makes real practical sense.

Recipients there are offered tea, coffee and biscuits, and a friendly non-judgemental confidential chat with one of the team leaders, to better understand the reasons why they need emergency short-term help from the foodbank, and to signpost them to other organisations and agencies who can help them with their problems. A system of vouchers records distributions and enables an audit.

It takes some courage to ask for foodbank help, and I would personally find it hard to pluck up courage to do that - but, contrary to what some people think, those who are helped in this way are by no means scroungers, but are really desperate.

My personal opinion is that it is really appalling that there is any need to operate voluntary foodbank centres in our wealthy UK, but it's a sad fact of life: people fall on hard times, or don't know how to make ends meet, and need our help. We have always been a nation that helps the desperate, and this is our way of showing compassion and kindness.

So - kind folks - please keep-up your donations, and next time you to go to one of the collection centres, at the three Churches, the Social Centre, or the Co-op, just a tin a week would make a huge difference, in helping the desperate!

## **County Councillor's Notes**



It's getting on for a year since I drew up a list of priorities in advance of the county council election. Top of the list was road safety. So it's really pleasing that new vehicle-activated speed signs have gone up in Isleham. And I am happy to report that the County Council has also agreed to this year's bid from Isleham Parish Council, which I strongly supported, for more equipment to help

tackle speeding through the village. The County and Parish Councils make an excellent partnership.

We are also making progress with other issues I campaigned on. The Mayor and county council have agreed the need to upgrade the A10. This has already moved forward to the point where a study of possible routes for a dualled road has been commissioned. The county council, the Mayor and our MP Lucy Frazer have lobbied the government for improvements to make the A14/A142 junction safer. And the plan for reopening the station at Soham is now in its design phase. Although there are still hurdles to be got over, there is no doubting the drive behind this project.

Things I didn't expect to be doing this time last year have included leading the County's Library Transformation project. As a result of that work, we have managed not only to keep all our libraries open and maintain the mobile service, but to add an extra quarter of a million pounds to the book fund – the core of what libraries are about. Libraries will also be doing more - in Soham, for example, the Neighbourhood Cares service, which is the new model for social care, is operating out of the library, while libraries have also started hosting music and theatre performances. And we are managing to do all this

within a total libraries budget that is roughly half what it was in 2010.

Less easy has been the County's decision that our school catering and cleaning service is no longer viable and will have to close. With so many of our schools now set up as academies, buying school meals and cleaning from other providers, CSS no longer has enough customers to keep going. I and my colleagues have made it very clear that if loyal customers like Isleham primary need help finding a new contractor, the county will support them to find one. I have offered Isleham's school governors my help with that if they need it.

A final update: I mentioned in my last notes that the County Council will be improving Prickwillow Road in the near future. This work was originally timetabled for February, but the date has now slipped. I am currently being told that it may happen in April.

## Speed Watch

I am pleased to inform residents that the Parish have been awarded a small grant from Cambridgeshire County Council to fund the establishment of a Speed Watch team within the village.

'Shown here are the 2 portable speed indicator signs that have been purchased with a grant from Cambridgeshire County Council. At the moment they are placed in Fordham Road and Pound Lane,

but will be moved around the village in the future. Parishioners have long expressed concern about the speeds some people reach entering and leaving the village.'

For those of you that are not aware, Speedwatch is not about enforcement; it is about raising awareness of speeding within communities and educating drivers. The key roles of a Speed Watch team are as follows:



- 1. Undertaking high visibility roadside operations.
- 2. Reporting to the Police the details of speeding vehicles. The police are then responsible for sending advisory letters to the registered vehicle owners.
- 3. Deliver locally based feedback and problem solving schemes.



## Hedgehogs

It's that lovely time of year again, Spring! Gardeners are working hard to prepare beautiful and productive gardens. As you toil, please spare a thought for

"the gardener's friend" the hedgehog.

It is well known that hedgehog numbers have halved in the last fifteen

years. There are several reasons for this drastic decline. It is estimated that tens of thousands are killed on the roads each year. The main reason for the decline, however, is thought to be the change in farming methods from pastoral to intensively-farmed arable land. This has resulted in the loss of the hedgehogs' natural habitat by the removal of hedges and loss of food sources -beetles, earthworms, caterpillars etc. by the use of insecticides.

- \* Hedgehogs increasingly need domestic gardens in which to forage for food.
- \* The implementation of the following simple steps are ways in which gardeners can create hedgehog friendly gar-

dens:



- \* A five inch square opening at ground level in the fence or wall will allow access for hedgehogs to move between gardens.
- \* Avoid using pesticides, particularly slug pellets. Put "escape" ramps in your pond. Leave a small area of gar-

den "wild".

- \* Remove low level netting. Construct a log pile as a shelter.
- \* Take care when strimming long grass.
- \* Check for the presence of hedgehogs before lighting a bonfire.
- \* Don't feed hedgehogs bread and milk but use meaty cat /dog food or proprietary hedgehog food, plus fresh water. (Friends of Isleham Nature Reserves)
