South East Cambridgeshire MP, Lucy Frazer was delighted to be appointed Parliamentary Under Secretary of State at the Ministry of Justice in the recent reshuffle. # Remembering..... Isleham Poppy Project

11 November 1918 marked the end of World War 1 and with it's 100 year anniversary coming up lots of creative people in Isleham thought it would be a lovely idea to commemorate this milestone by using our talents to create a huge poppy display at St Andrew's Church. Isleham is renowned for its wonderful community spirit so we thought it could also be a celebration this too.

We are in the early stages of this project and are asking if all the creative people of Isleham would like to join in. Can you knit, crochet, embroider, quilt, sew? If so we would love to have you on board. We have set up a facebook group called 'Isleham Poppy Project' where you can chat about the project and find patterns that can be used. A Pinterest board has also been created (www.pinterest/scentsweetpeas/poppy-patterns) where we are pinning patterns that we find. All we ask it that the poppies are red and will withstand the weather – wool, felt, fabric etc are ideal.

Not connected to the internet? Don't worry, you can still join in. We have popped a couple of patterns below to get you started. If you would like to be kept up to date on the event then please pop your name and address on a piece of paper along with the fact that you would like to take part in the Poppy Project and put it through Zoe's door at 44 Sun Street and Zoe will endeavour keep you up to date via letter.

As mentioned we have only just started this project and have lots of exciting ideas in the pipeline from lighting effects, group meetings to create together and a large scale art installation at the Church (with the kind permission of Revd David and Revd Sue). Lets make this project amazing!

A pattern to get those who love crochet & knitting to get started:

Crochet Poppy Pattern (with thanks to Helen Garbett) Red dk yarn using a 3/3.5 mm hook.

Create a magic loop

Round 1 – Make 3 ch, then make 16 trebles into the ring. Join with a slip stitch into the 3rd of starting chain (16 stitches) Petals

Row 1 – Make 3 ch (counts as 1st trbl) and 1 trbl into same space, then make 2 trbls into each of the next 3 stitches (8 stitches in total), turn

Row 2 – Make 3 chain (this counts as 1st trbl). Then make 1 trbl into next stitch. Then 2 trbls in to each of the next 4 stitches, then 1 trbl into each of the last 2 stitches (12 stitches in total), turn.

Row 3 – Make 1 chain and 1 double crochet into 1st stitch. \*Now make 2 chain, 1 double crochet into next stitch\* Repeat from \* to \* until end of petal.

Make 1 chain and slip stitch down side of petal and into next stitch of round 1 and repeat Rows 1 – 3 to make 2nd petal. Continue in this manner until 4 petals are made. Slip stitch down side of 4th petal and fasten off.

Stitch a black button into the centre or embroider the centre with black thread/yarn. Remember to leave some yarn in the centre at the back so we can attach the poppy to the display.

### **Highways Report:**

- Despite the recent repainting of yellow lines on West Street and Mill Street, parking outside the Co-Op remains a major concern, with drivers continuing to park either across the footpath or on the double yellow lines. This clearly causes danger to pedestrians and other drivers as well as damaging the pavement. Can we please ask all residents to ensure they use the designated parking spaces at the rear and immediately in front of the building?
- Similarly, can we politely ask residents NOT to park their vehicles on grass verges as this damages both the verges and footpaths
- Residents are asked to note that major delays may result from repairs to Prickwillow Road in March.
- We expect the delivery of three Vehicle Activated Speed signs, which have been largely funded by a grant from Cambridgeshire County Council by the end of January.

# **County Councillor's Notes**



This winter has brought its usual tally of potholes, fallen branches and floods, and the County Council has been out dealing with them. Beyond dealing with what is urgent, though, work also goes on to tackle some of our longstanding challenges. For those of us who live in Isleham, the state of the Prickwillow Road is one of those permanent niggles, taking its toll on tyres, suspen-

sion and (in my car at least) passengers' heads. Part of the problem is that, like many Fen roads, it rests on peat that changes shape as it dries out, so its problems are more than a matter of patching up potholes.

So I am very pleased to report that the County Council is now going to re-make two big sections of the Prickwillow Road, giving them a new bed, constructed by a new method. Of course, that means the road will have to be closed for a time. Council officers have told me that individual residents who live along Prickwillow Road will be getting a letter explaining how they will be affected. The work is due to happen in late February. There will also be updates on the council website and via social media. I really hope the inconvenience will be short, and justified by the benefits of a road that is safer to drive along in future.

A less good piece of news is about the Council Tax. I think people who've spoken to me know that I want to keep the council tax low. I think it's a good thing that Cambridgeshire charges less than most counties. So I would much prefer it our County Council's tax didn't have to go up in April. But the simple facts are that the services we run have to be paid for somehow; demand for those services is rising; and government grant to the council has been cut a lot.

Just as one example, the number of people leaving Addenbrooke's hospital each week and needing care from the council's social services went up by half in December. The pressure on the NHS that we all hear about on the news is also pressure on the county council. Our council tax rise is, in effect, helping to bail out the NHS.

The council has a good record on keeping its costs down: we spend less on services than all (except one) of the places that are like us, and our tax is below average too. But however efficient we are, we can't turn away elderly people who need care or children who must be looked after to be safe. I nevertheless want to see the council carry on making savings and becoming even more efficient, and I know my colleagues are committed to that.

But Cambridgeshire also gets far less money from the government than other places. We receive £23 per person from the government. Central London Boroughs get £225 a person – ten times as much. If we got as much from Whitehall as some other councils, we'd be able to talk about reducing the council tax! This simply isn't fair, and my colleagues and I, including our local MP, are campaigning for fairer funding.
