

The Beeches Entertainers bring a bit of Magic

The Beeches Entertainers took to the stage at the start of April with the long-awaited pantomime "Aladdin". Postponed from 2020 when it was just two weeks' away from going on stage and the first covid lockdown came into place, the team finally brought the show to The Beeches in front of over 300 people over the three-show run.



The audiences were treated to an adaptation of the traditional story, with Aladdin (Vala Taylor) trying to win the heart of Princess Jasmine (Micheala Farr), assisted along the way by Widow Twankey (Richard Drayton), Wishy Washy (Pauline Wilkes) and their cat Tiddles (Ruth Bendall) and of course the Genie of the Ring (Marie Bowker) and Genie of the Lamp (Ray Goodwin). They were up against the evil Count Tooten (John Bedford), who had real trouble controlling the palace guards Ping (Cynthia Sheldrick) and Pong (Mark Fletcher). There was plenty of singing and dancing too, with the chorus (Bob, Caty, Chris, Jerome, Nikki, Noah, and Sally) providing colourful and fun numbers to sing along to, thanks also to Wayne Bailey who helped with the chorus' choreography. Tim Washtell and Steve Evans did a great job keeping everyone in tune, and with great lighting effects. The team were also joined by Ellouise, Lily and Niyah from Ruth Bendall's dance group who did a lovely job of entertaining the audiences while the backstage staff (Barbara Murfitt and Julie Aldous) made changes to the scenery.

A member of the Beeches Entertainer's team said "We were so pleased to finally get on stage, Lesley (Gunn) started to write this panto in the summer of 2019 so it's taken a long time to get to this point. It has also been a very testing few months, and many of our team had to take time away from rehearsals with covid and other illnesses. In fact we were one person down for the performances as Vanessa (Smith), who was due to join us in the chorus, was unwell at the time. It was also the first time we had to include a full compliment of understudies, just in case Covid struck our main characters, and it really was touch and go at one point, but the reactions from our audiences really told us how much they enjoyed the shows and made it all worthwhile." The team not only welcomed new faces on stage this year (Caty, Jerome, Mark and Noah), but were also delighted to see so many new faces in the audiences as well.

The Ark Church



As I write the government has relaxed some of the rules allowing Ukrainian refugees to come to the UK. I, like many of us, have been thinking through how I can best help. At the Ark we have direct contacts with Polish and Romanian churches and have send money as they look after some of the many Ukrainians who have fled their own homes to go to neighbouring countries.

Before the pandemic we held some church meetings with migrant workers mostly from Eastern Europe and occasionally a few Ukrainians would come along. This week one of them contacted me on Facebook asking if the church would be able to accommodate her and her young son, if the Russian army got any closer. I said "yes", in reality I am her friend, and she was asking me and my family, but I'm sure many people would be willing.

This article is normally about events at the Ark Church, what's happening and how the community can join in. There is an important event that is happening at the Ark, at other churches and in every corner of society. That event is each of us asking "have I got space - space in my house, space in my life, space in my heart?" I have just been sent some photographs from Poland showing Paul, a chap from the Ark, who shares his time between Poland and Isleham helping local churches as they accommodate refugees. The Ukrainians have broad smiles and whatever concerns and anxieties I have melt away.

Sometimes I think accommodating a few people only scratches the surface! But then I am reminded that God has a remarkable habit of taking what we have and doing something extraordinary with it!

<u>St Andrew's Church News</u> for sleham

At the time of writing the news of conflict in Ukraine casts a dark shadow over the world. The local community's response in organising donations in kind, fundraising and in offering to host refugees, among many other gestures of support, has been remarkable. It's my fervent prayer that by the time you will be reading this the worst of the fighting will be over, and that peace will be a real prospect, though the relief effort and the need to rebuild trust and relationships will surely still be ongoing.

April, May and early June offer us much by way of celebration and distraction as 2022 rolls on. For the church, Easter, falling this year on Sunday 17 April, is the greatest of feasts; the time when we welcome and celebrate new life in and through our risen Lord Jesus Christ. We will be 'making a joyful noise' in worship with a eucharist service in every church in the Group that day (see below), including the much loved 'Dawn Service' (at 5am) with breakfast at Chippenham when we light the new paschal candle from a brazier and declare that 'Christ is Risen! He is risen indeed. Alleluia!' If you're intrigued – do join us!

The joy of Easter Sunday feels the more exuberant as it follows hard on the heels of Holy Week, which is a much more sombre time. But it's also an important stage on our annual and lifelong journeys of faith as we remember the events leading up to Jesus's crucifixion, and ask ourselves where we stand in the crowd. The season of Easter stretches over 7 weeks, including Ascension Day (40 days after Easter Day), until the next great feast of Pentecost, or Whitsun, sometimes celebrated as the church's birthday since it marks the day when the Holy Spirit descended on Jesus's disciples and gave them the gift of speaking in many languages so that the Gospel could be spread throughout the world.

The other great celebration we're anticipating at this time, and especially in this issue, is the magnificent landmark of Her Majesty the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, marking 70 years since she came to the throne in 1952. The Coronation Service took place the following year, on 2 June 1953, at Westminster Abbey, where all the kings and queens of England have been crowned since William the Conqueror, on Christmas Day in 1066. But fans of Netflix's series The Crown, or the film The King's Speech may have noticed a more local landmark feature in their coronation scenes. Both were filmed at Ely Cathedral!

Queen Elizabeth II's coronation has a special place in history for a number of reasons. It marked a turning point in the nation's mood after the years of rationing and austerity following the Second World War. It was also a technological watershed, with the number of people watching the event on television (many on brand new sets, or round at a neighbour's) outstripping those listening on the radio for the first time. Perhaps a lesser known fact is that the 1953 coronation was the first time a congregational hymn was included – 'All people that on earth do dwell'.

Let's hope that the weather will be kinder and more congenial for the street parties being planned to mark the Platinum Jubilee than it was in 1953 (when it rained!). Let's hope too that the Jubilee will, like the new reign it commemorates did all those year ago, help us turn a corner after the challenging times we've recently experienced. Following more than two years of hard work, I'm pleased to report that the Isleham Neighbourhood Plan has been accepted by the external examiner and is now subject to a formal referendum. This is the last stage of a complicated process before it can be adopted by East Cambridgeshire District Council

Everyone on the voting register who lives within the Parish of Isleham is eligible to vote. If you are new to the Village you would have needed to register before 8th April

For the reasons identified below it is very important that residents vote in support of this plan : Firstly, what is a Neighbourhood Plan?

Neighbourhood planning is a way for communities to take a proactive approach to deciding the future of the places where they live and work. Communities can use a neighbourhood plan to help shape the future development and use of land in their neighbourhood. This includes the development of homes, shops, offices and infrastructure.

A Neighbourhood Plan helps set out a community's vision for their area over the next 20 years. Once adopted the Neighbourhood Plan has the same legal status as the Local Plan. The Neighbourhood Plan will be part of the statutory development plan for the district. It will be used in deciding planning applications for the area.

A Neighbourhood Plan can:

- Propose more development than the Local Plan
- Identify the most suitable sites for development
- Help to determine what types and design of development should take place

A Neighbourhood Plan cannot:

- Propose less growth than in the Local Plan
- Prevent any development from ever taking place in an area
- Be in conflict with national or local planning policies

'Our vision is that this Neighbourhood Plan should help maintain and further improve the character, infrastructure and environmental features of our village for both the current and future generations. Our aims for this plan are that:

• The history of our village will be honoured and maintained, with new history being recognised and celebrated

• Isleham will maintain its visual and physical separation from Fordham and that its place in the locality will grow positively in terms of both its independence and its interdependence of other local towns and villages

• As the population of Isleham inevitably grows, it will be a place where everyone; feels safe, welcomed, experiences positive wellbeing and is able to contribute to our very special community.
The demand for new housing will be justified, carefully planned and will have a positive impact on the

villages distinctive character and semi- rural environment.
That the natural landscape including footpaths, green spaces and valued views will be protected and where wildlife and habitats are able to flourish

• That as the village experiences growth, there will be proportionate improvements to the infra-structure of our village including increased employment opportunities and transport links
