



Policy GROWTH 2 of the East Cambridgeshire Local Plan 2015 restricts development outside of defined development envelopes to the specific categories of exception development listed within the policy, provided there is no significant adverse impact on the character of the countryside and that other Local Plan policies are satisfied. In addition, policies 1a and 2 of the Isleham Neighbourhood Plan restrict development outside of the defined Isleham development envelope to specific categories of exception development listed within those policies. The proposed development is not for any of the specific categories of development that can be permitted, as an exception, outside of the defined development envelope for Isleham. The proposed development is therefore contrary to the locational strategy for development within Isleham, as set out within policy GROWTH 2 of the East Cambridgeshire Local Plan 2015 and policies 1a and 2 of the Isleham Neighbourhood Plan. DCREOUTZ 2 The proposal for 4 dwellings situated within this edge of settlement location would create an intrusive urbanising impact upon the surrounding rural landscape, eroding the predominately rural character of the countryside setting, causing detrimental harm to the character and amenities of the area. The dwellings would interrupt views over open countryside and would contribute to the erosion of the rural character of this part of Isleham. On this basis the proposal is considered contrary to policies ENV 1 and ENV 2 of the East Cambridgeshire Local Plan 2015 by damaging the rural character of the area.

We are also most grateful for the many residents who completed the recent survey in support of our grant application for funding to install traffic calming measures on Pound Lane. We will update residents on the status of this application asap.

Priory Car Park We are most grateful to the vast majority of people using the Priory Car Park for adhering to the new rules. Some concerns have been expressed however that some residents are still failing to park in the designated bays and this is affecting access to / exit from the site and setting a precedent for other drivers to do likewise. We have and continue to invest in improving this area of the village and we would therefore appreciate your cooperation on this matter.

Recreation Ground We await the legal transfer of a parcel of land to the north of the existing recreation ground as part of the Bloor Homes development and are currently considering various options for what this land might be used for. We would like to thank local residents for adhering to the rule of not bringing their dogs onto the recreation field.

Dunstall Charity Grant Applications for a £400 grant for those starting apprentices or certain further education courses are open. I copy below the criteria for this grant.

- 1. Applicants must have been resident in Isleham for one year, be under 25 years of age and submit a letter of application to the Clerk.
- 2. The maximum grant available under the scheme will be £400.
- 3. Applicants must have spent the money first, and send in original receipts with their application.
- 4. Applicants must be serving an apprenticeship, for example chef, mechanic, engineering, or be a University student or student of further education at university level studying for a specific career, for example geologist, computing, law.

The same is true today, each week at the Ark I am delighted to hear stories of what God is doing in people's lives, they are all different and often bring me to tears.

I and many others have been reflecting on the life of Audrey Chipper, a key person in the life of High Street Church and later as it moved to The Ark. I have noticed that even in grief it is possible to know God's presence, His healing and peace. It's also a time to reflect and take every opportunity to give thanks for her life and its effect on so many.

Our Sunday worship continues to be supported by our bell ringers and our

choir, both of whom practice on Friday evenings, and new members are always welcome at both groups, no experience is necessary! Everyone is welcome at any of these gatherings, and please do contact us if you'd like to find out more details about any of these regular services and meet-ups.

On Tuesday morning, we continue to hold a coffee morning after the morning prayer service which runs until 12 noon, serving hot bacon rolls alongside tea, coffee and other refreshments. Speedwatch

SPEED KILLS

If you hit a pedestrian in your car:

- at 40 mph there is a 90 percent chance they will be killed.
- at 35 mph there is a 50 percent chance they will be killed.
- at 30 mph there is a 20 percent chance they will be killed.
- at 20 mph there is a 2.5 percent chance they will be killed

Approximately 20% of cars are exceeding the speed limit when we do Speedwatch despite the fact we are highly visible.

The main aim of Speedwatch is to remind people of the limits around the village, to try to ensure the safety of children, pets and all road users.

Volunteers who can help with Speedwatch sessions are urgently needed. Can you spare the odd hour?

Training takes 1 hour, usually whilst doing a speedwatch session. After that you can come to sessions as often as your schedule allows, as long as 3 people are available they can be done at any time in the daylight.

Isleham's Wailing Heath Chickens

During these spring and summer nights some of you may have heard a loud, drawn-out, curlew-like call from a mysteri-



ous creature flying over the village. This is the Stone Curlew – a nocturnal bird also known as the Thicknee or colloquially (in Norfolk) the Wailing Heath Chicken.

The Stone Curlew is a summer visitor, arriving in March but rare in Britain with only around 400 pairs, mainly in The Brecks and the Wiltshire Downs. It's a strange-looking bird, rather larger than a partridge with long yellow legs and a staring yellow eye and beautifully camouflaged to enable it to hide up during the day in dry open heathlands or in the sparsely vegetated arable fields (it seems to prefer onion or young sugar beet fields) where it breeds in low numbers.

The ones we can hear from the village are probably moving from their nest sites to some favoured fields to feed on worms and beetles during the night. It's a bird of conservation concern and protected under wildlife legislation and as a result has started to increase in numbers from a low point in the 1980's. Difficult to see, and easily disturbed, your best chances of getting a good view are from a hide at the Norfolk WildlifeTrust reserve at Weeting Heath.


